NEW COURSES

FCS

336 VALUE OF PLAY IN HUMAN DEVELOPMENT
3 sem. hrs.

Study of the value of play to development; theories in historical and contemporary perspectives; explanations in behavior, relationships, and culture. Not for credit if had FCS 392. Prerequisites: FCS 250, 251, 254, or 304 or consent of the instructor.

MUS

325 ADVANCED JAZZ IMPROVISATION I
2 sem. hrs.

Application of advanced harmonic, melodic and rhythmic improvisational techniques for the experienced jazz player. Prerequisite: Grade of C or better in MUS 228 or consent of the instructor.

326 ADVANCED JAZZ IMPROVISATION II
2 sem. hrs.

Applications of advanced harmonic, melodic and rhythmic improvisational techniques for the experienced jazz player; a continuation of MUS 325. Prerequisite: Grade of C or better in MUS 325 or consent of the instructor.

327 JAZZ ARRANGING
2 sem. hrs.

Students develop arranging skills in the jazz idiom through studying common approaches to melody, harmony, and orchestration. Prerequisites: MUS 157 and 222 or consent of the instructor.

(Increased hours)

381 OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ACT (OSHA)

4 sem. hrs.

Interpretation of the provisions of the Occupational Safety and Health Act; the regulations, standards, and reporting requirements pursuant to it. Prerequisites: HSC 170, 271; CHE 140 or concurrent.

MUS

Proposed catalog copy for the new JAZZ STUDIES SEQUENCE in the MAJOR IN MUSIC, B.M.

Jazz Studies Sequence:

Only available to students on the following instruments: saxophone, trumpet, trombone, guitar, piano, bass, and percussion.

- **74 hours in Music required.**
- **39 hours required: IDS 121A03; *MUS 100 (2 semester hours), 101, 102, 107, 108, 167, 201, 207, 213, 222, 253, 254, 275A01, 355A06; 8 semesters of Jazz Ensemble I or II (jazz big bands) (for jazz studies majors this fulfills the “Major Performing Ensemble Requirements”); 6 semesters of MUS 110 (transfer students must enroll in MUS 110 each semester on campus up to a total of 6 semesters).**
- **16 hours Applied Music: 4 semesters (8 hours) of traditional (classical) applied music on the student’s major instrument: 4 semesters (8 hours) of applied jazz, of which at least 2 semesters (4 hours) must be at the 200 level.**
- **4 hours Piano: Complete 3 hours of MUS 122 and Level III Piano Proficiency. Jazz Studies majors must complete one hour of MUS 122A60 Group Instruction Piano which focuses on jazz keyboard skills.**
- **15 hours jazz courses: MUS 123, 157, 218, 228, 325, 326, 327.**
- **Perform one junior recital (30 minutes), and one senior recital (60 minutes).**
- **Electives to complete 120 hours.**
- **A grade of C or better is required in all courses in the major.**

NOTE: MUS 275A01 fulfills the General Education Fine Arts requirement and the Global Studies requirement and IDS 121A03 fulfills the Language and Humanities requirement.

***Students fulfill MUS 100 requirement by taking MUS 100 or MUS 100A01 and 100A02 for one hour each.**

REVISED PROGRAM

AGR

Summary of the proposal to revise the AGRONOMY MANAGEMENT SEQUENCE:

The total hours required will stay the same (55 hours of Agriculture) for this sequence. The specific changes requested include:

- ***Required Agriculture courses: increase to 34 hours (from 28 hours).***
- ***Add existing Agriculture courses to requirements: AGR 110, 120, 203.***
- ***Deletion of “choose one from AGR 110 or 170.”***
- ***Changed Agribusiness requirement: 12 hours of senior level Agribusiness courses (from 15 hours).***

- ***Changed Agronomy electives requirement: 6 hours of Agronomy electives (from 12)***
- ***Changed Agronomy electives requirement: Addition of “senior hours” to Agronomy electives description.***
- ***Addition of Horticulture course requirement: 3 hours of a senior level Horticulture course.***
- ***Additional required courses: none. Delete "(6-12 hours): BSC 101 or 196 or 197; CHE 102, or 110 and 112, or 140 and 141."***

Agronomy Management Sequence:

—55 hours in Agriculture required.

—Required Agriculture courses (28 hours): AGR 109, 150, 157, 234, 272, 305, 357, and choose one from AGR 110 or 170.

—15 hours of senior level Agribusiness courses.

—12 hours of Agronomy electives.

—Additional required courses (6-12 hours): BSC 101 or 196 or 197; CHE 102, or 110 and 112, or 140 and 141.
