## 3. Proposal Discussion:

a. MAT – Mathematics Accelerated Sequence (New)

It was noted that while the undergraduate Major in Math allows options for both the B.A. and B.S. degrees, the proposed Accelerated Sequence would apply only to the B.S. degree.

There was discussion about how to denote courses that students in the Accelerated Sequence should take for graduate credit (they must take at least one course at the graduate level to remain in the sequence). While MAT 349 and other 300-level courses are available for graduate credit, the department wishes students in the Accelerated Sequence to take at least one of the courses that are required in the Master's program (MAT 336, 337, and 347); thus, these are the courses that have been marked with asterisks in the catalog copy. It was decided to add \* to these courses in the elective groups as well, as shown below.

Take three or more courses (10-11 credit hours) of additional Mathematics electives. All electives cannot be from same elective aroup. Please consult your academic advisor.

Algebra: MAT 330, 336\*, 33<mark>7\*</mark>

Analysis: MAT 340, 341, 345, 347\*, 349

Discrete: MAT 361, 362, 363 Statistics: MAT 351 Research: MAT 268

# b. IDS - Minor in Urban Studies (Revision)

**Duce and Lippert** 

The revision includes addition of two CJS courses (CJS 210 and 389A24) as elective options in the minor. An email note of support from CJS was included. However, since CJS 389A24 is a temporary course, it cannot be included in the catalog copy for the program. A proposal for a permanent course to replace CJS 389A24 is apparently in the works. It was agreed that approval of the revisions could be made with the stipulation that CJS 389A24 be replaced with the permanent course when it becomes available. Lindsey indicated that she could make this change.

c. LAN – German Teacher Education Sequence (Revision)

Mikulec and Cook

This revision includes adding GER 385 as a required course, moving some courses from required to recommended electives (GER 217, 310, 317, 322) and adding another course to the recommended electives list (GER 285). It also clarifies the total required hours as 67 (rather than a range of 67 to 75).

The proposal also includes the assumption that LAN 321 has been added and TCH 219 has been removed from the requirements. This change has not yet been approved by UCC, as the proposal for that change at some point got behind in the approval process. Thus, any action taken on this proposal will have to be made pending approval of the LAN 321/TCH 219 change (which will be discussed at an upcoming meeting).

# 4. Liaison Reports

### **Council on Teacher Education: Mikulec**

A number of secondary education program proposals have been reviewed with changes that include dropping an EAF course and adding SED 344. Many of the proposals have the same copy for the rationale. Departments are not indicating specific courses that meet this content and how they are meeting the clinical hours. CTE is asking departments to add this information.

### **Council on General Education: Standard**

CGE discussed a proposed new IDS Minor in Entrepreneurship. The proposal was returned for revisions.
